Review of Minutes: A motion to approve the minutes was made by Glen Hogsett, a second was made by Amie Baker. The motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Sue Smith. Sue is optimistic that the indoor concession stand will turn a profit this year, which hasn't always happened in years past. A debit of \$700 was taken out of the 3-on-3 Suburban Slam profit for a disputed janitor's bill that was finally settled. The winter tournaments all did well this year with the Tip-Off Tournament taking in a \$3000 profit, the Holiday Tournament, which doesn't always make much money, earned about \$2000 and the Wrestling Tournament made around \$1000. Spirit clothing has a debit of \$1000 but we should break about even in the long run - selling clothing is more of a service than a money maker. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Tom Sprigle, a second was made by Kim George. The motion carried.

Bob thanked all the volunteers for their efforts which has contributed to the healthy fund balance.

Assistant Treasurer: Jenny Foster. Jenny has just deposited \$1600 for indoor concessions for the past 3 boys' basketball games last week.

1. Clothing: Bob Perina. Bob said the Booster Club was the go between for the Pep Band T-shirts that were recently ordered and received.
2. Poster Night: Julie Little. Julie has the next date reserved and confirmed: Wednesday, March 18th from 5-8:00 PM in the cafeteria. Julie has noticed that more people seem to be showing up to help with the posters than in past years.
3. Meet the Teams Night: Shelly Bixler-Kint. Not present. Bob points out that the Spring Meet the Teams Night is on Wednesday, March 10th at 7:30 in the high school gym.

Scholarship: Jenny Foster. No report.

New Business:

1. A potential fundraiser for the Booster Club to consider. Chris Sawhney from Claire's Gourmet out of Baltimore came to talk about her company which makes foods such as pretzels, pizza, cookie dough and desserts specifically for fundraising. A sample of the coffee cake was available for tasting and the consensus was a big thumbs up!

Old Business:

1. Macadam Pathway Project. Bob said the project passed unanimously and will move forward. Another quote was necessary, as the first one expired, and Kinsley has agreed to do the work for the same price quoted - \$3600. On February 2nd, Bob, Sue Smith and Tom Sprigle will present the plan to the School Board Planning Committee, a pre-meeting to the School Board meeting

on February 23rd, where they will vote on it. After approval, scheduling to get it done is the next step - probably in the March timeframe. Bob thanks everyone for their input.

2. Outdoor Concession Stand Manager. Bob notes that Randy Robertson has expressed interest in the job and no one else has contacted him about it. He feels Randy would be great for the job. He has experience at the outdoor concession stand and is willing to get food safety certified. Laurel Graff, YS Band President, has endorsed Randy as well.

Amie Baker voiced concern that some parents do not get to see their kids play basketball because they can't get to the game early enough to buy tickets and it is sold out by the time they do get there. She knows that happened to some for the Eastern game last week. She suggested that parents of players receive a couple of tickets for their family ahead of time so that they are guaranteed admission. Larry says the coach is given 2 tickets per player (JV and Varsity) for that specific purpose. Amie will look into it because she was never offered any tickets to buy from the coach.

Bev Schryver reminds everyone that Post Prom needs support, both monetary and volunteers. Please keep that in mind and contribute what you can.

Sue Smith moved to adjourn the January meeting, seconded by Jenny Foster. The meeting adjourned at 7:55 PM.
