The March meeting of the York Suburban All-Sports Booster Club was called to order by President Bob Perina at 7:05PM.

Teams are beginning to spend their allocations. Sue reminded the team representatives that only \$500 of their respective allocation may be carried over to the next year. Our net income to date is \$7373.43. Our current total fund balance is \$67,238.30. Celeste brought up the Principal's Fund, which is to be used at the discretion of Principal Greenholt. Because Mr. Greenholt is new to the district, Bob will make him aware of this fund.

Athletic Director: Larry Ludwig. Bob, speaking for Larry, mentioned that Meet the Teams Night has been changed to Thursday, March 12 at 8:00PM in the main gym.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Webmaster: Tom Sprigle. Tom no longer needs to purchase website development software because a friend gave him a copy of a software program. Tom has received updates to keep our website's content fresh. He will post forms, e.g. turf rules, physicals, etc. on the site. As of 3/1/09, our website has had 8,109 hits but we need to keep the momentum going.

Event Scheduling Manager: Kim George. Currently, there are no problems with the team allocation scheduling.

1. Suburban Relays. Committee is looking to upgrade the Relays T-shirt to moisture-wicking fabric which will increase the expense but make the shirt more special to commemorate the 50th anniversary of this event.
2. Girls' Soccer Tournament. Concession/admission volunteers are already scheduled. Sue Steckler will look into creating a program with participating team rosters. Sue will talk to Coach Shugars about tournament awards. Bob and Sue will discuss tournament T-shirts with Coach Shugars.

New Business. Outdoor Concession Stand Operation. Bob Perina, Sue Smith and band representatives, Laurel and Art Graff, met with several members of YS administration to discuss food safety in the outdoor concession stand. Joan Klinke, YS Coordinator of Food Services, met with a PA Dept of Agriculture representative to discuss and arrange food safety certification. A free 2 hour class, taught by Sandy Panzer, will be offered at YS to train any Booster Club and Band volunteers interested in becoming food safety certified. YS administrators encouraged as many volunteers as possible to become certified. At the request of YS administrators, Helen Snyder will conduct random, surprise inspections of the outdoor concession stand, especially at the beginning of the spring sports schedule. Helen will be paid \$15/hour on weekdays and \$22.50/hour on weekends to check general cleanliness, food temperatures and other food safety procedures. This cost will be shared by the Booster Club and Band Parent Association. Randy Robertson is aware of this situation and understands he will have a checklist detailing his responsibilities. Helen would make notes of any corrections that need to be made. Bob will notify everyone by email once a date for the class has been set. The YS administration had no concerns regarding the indoor concession stand at this time. Spring cleaning of the outdoor concession stand is slated for this weekend.

Old Business:

1. Macadam Pathway Project. The YS School Board and Spring Garden Township have approved this project. No timetable yet on when this project will start.
2. Concession Stand Manager. Randy Robertson officially accepted this position.
3. Retirees. Tom Sprigle moved to approve up to \$100 to be spent on gift certificates for upcoming YS retirees. Jenny Foster seconded the motion.
4. Bumper Stickers. Bob showed an example of bumper stickers. The Band Association ordered similar bumper stickers, but no one wanted them. It was decided to drop this idea.

Sue Smith moved to adjourn the meeting and Jenny Foster seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned at 7:54PM.
