The November meeting of the York Suburban All-Sports Booster Club was called to order by President Bob Perina at 7:03 PM.

Review of Minutes: A motion was made to approve the minutes by Glen Hogsett; a second was made by Jenny Foster. The motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Sue Smith. Indoor concessions operated at a loss this year and Sue doesn't hold out much hope that the outdoor concessions made much money either. We have made \$2350.77 so far in Fall Programs this year. The JV Tournament made \$1410.20 and the Suburban Slam has made \$6879.18 with money still coming in and bills still to pay. Spirit clothing owes a small amount, Sue is hoping for a profit soon. A motion to accept the financial report was made by Kim George; a second was made by Jenny Foster. The motion carried.

Assistant Treasurer: Jenny Foster. No report.

Athletic Director: Larry Ludwig. No Report. Bob Perina brought up the subject of banquet venues - a place with a good price, location and a kid's menu (\$5.00 less). Larry said that Heritage Hills is \$2.00 more per meal than any other place we use and they do not have a kid's meal. Bev Schryver asked if anyone would offer a price cut by only going to one place for all banquets. Larry said no. York Fairgrounds is a possibility. Heritage is just getting too expensive. Larry said they will decide the fate of Heritage Hills at the November meeting.

Webmaster: Tom Sprigle. No report. Bob says what a great service, great site, good pics - reminded everybody to send in info and pictures.

Concession Scheduler: Kim George. Kim said that 2 teams (baseball, girls' tennis) both missed their events. Baseball has since made it up. If an opportunity presents itself, girls' tennis will get another chance. Bob mentions some special upcoming events:

Glen says there is some confusion over what allocation money can be used for. He suggests a list of what allocation can and can't be used for. Bob will try to get a list together. Larry adds that allocation money has to benefit the whole team.

Awards & Flowers: Kim Jones. Not present. Bob spoke to Kim and she is very pleased with how well team reps are communicating with her this year.

Spiritwear: Bob Perina. Bob would love suggestions on items for the spiritwear tent. Gina says yard signs would be nice (Stambaugh's sells them).

Poster Night: Julie Little. Not present. Bob heard from Julie and the cafeteria is reserved for Wednesday, December 10th from 5:00-8:00 PM.

Meet the Teams: Shelly Bixler-Kint. Not present. Bob tells everyone that Meet the Teams night is scheduled for Tuesday, December 2nd at 7:30 PM.

Scholarship: Jenny Foster. Jenny has received 11 essays from fall sports.

New Business: Bob announced that someone has stepped up for the President-Elect position: Tom Sprigle. A motion was made to nominate Tom as President-Elect. Marie McInerney offered a second. The motion carried.

Old Business:

1. Suburban Slam went very well. Bob heard lots of positive feedback.
2. Macadam path estimate, possible special project donated by the Booster Club. Bob distributed the estimate and opened the floor to comments. Gina Kruper agrees with Marie - she questions how the swim team benefits from a macadam path. The question was asked if the Booster Club has enough money to pay for this project. Sue Smith answers yes. Tom Sprigle asks if there are any regulations that the District hasn't complied with yet. Bev Schryver suggests going to a school board meeting and

tell them about the problem. If the school board won't do anything about it, then maybe the Booster Club should. Bob will talk to Administration about it.

3. Outdoor Concessions Pricing - Tom Sprigle distributed a spreadsheet of food prices from other area concessions stands. A special committee will meet with Helen sometime in the next week and will have a report at the next meeting.

4. New Cheerleading team rep - Tammy Sprigle. Welcome aboard!

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Glen Hogsett. A second was made by Caroline Morris. The meeting ended at 8:19 PM.
