

York Suburban All-Sports Booster Club  
September 14, 2009

The September meeting of the York Suburban All-Sports Booster Club was called to order by President Tom Sprigle.

Review of Minutes: A motion to approve the June minutes was made by Sue Smith; a second was made by Celeste Hinnenkamp. The motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Sue Smith. Sue distributed two sets of statements; one for the 2008/2009 season, which ended July 15, 2009, and one for the start of the 2009/2010 season. She noted that almost \$22,000 was spent in team allocation for the 2008/2009 school year. Sue points out that at the start of the 2009/2010 school year, the outdoor concession has a negative balance of \$4,552.49. She explains that the outdoor stand went through significant improvements over the summer, as required by the District - \$2300 went towards painting, power washing, etc. and \$775 went towards stainless steel tables. Part of that negative balance is for start-up money for the concession stand which we should have back by the next booster club meeting. In addition, the band will pay us back for half of everything; they just are low on cash at this point in time. The District has also agreed to forfeit their 10% of concession stand profits this year, about \$1200, to help offset the cost of the required upgrades. Not sure about future years, discussions will happen. A vote will be needed at the next meeting to decide what to do with the two CDs that have come due. Sue mentions that some coaches have not yet given her their invoices for the approved allocation requests that she received months ago. She would like to clear these up within the next month. Kathy Donahue wonders if team reps can be notified when an allocation request is accepted. That is something Tom can do. Bev Schryver says it helps when the coach gives allocation information to the team rep. Bob Perina says to make sure to submit allocation requests before submitting bills. Larry Ludwig notes that in some cases that isn't practical, an example being Girls Tennis where they need to pay for court time in the summer before school starts. Sue said that hasn't been a problem in the past because Coach Platt would notify her of upcoming bills. Since there is a new coach this year, she should be made aware of the process for this special situation. A motion to accept the financial report was made by Celeste Hinnenkamp; a second was made by Sue Huth. The motion carried.

Assistant Treasurer: Tammy Sprigle. No report.

## President-Elect: Open Position

Athletic Director: Larry Ludwig. Larry says the school does not have money in the budget to pay for the warm-ups for Boys and Girls Lacrosse and was hoping that the Booster Club could pay half the cost (\$65 per top per athlete; \$80-90 for both top and bottom per athlete). Tom said it will have to come from their allocation. Bev Schryver and Marie McInerney mentioned that both Boys and Girls Volleyball do not have warm-ups. Larry said they do. Marie suggests Larry make a list of uniforms and when they were purchased. Caroline Morris asks when its time for new uniforms (every 5 years according to Larry) could someone let them know. Bev Schryver wonders if they can buy sweatshirts for the Girls' Volleyball team with team allocation. Tom says teams that buy clothing through allocation money get to keep the clothing whereas when the district buys clothing for a team, it stays with the team. As a general rule, food can no longer be purchased with allocation money. Caroline Morris mentions that she has a hard time getting people to help with food. Sarah Perina suggests collecting money from parents at the beginning of the season for food (nominal amount like \$5). Tom will send out another e-mail regarding team allocation to team reps and coaches.

Awards and Flowers: Kim Jones. Kim would like confirmation regarding Senior Nights for all fall teams. Tom will send an e-mail to the coaches to confirm dates.

Fall Sports Program: Tom Sprigle for LaDawn Huber. The fall program is done and everything made it in except for one ad which Tom didn't think had been paid when in fact it had been (payment came with a different company name). Tom asks reps if they want to take programs to try and sell at their home games, come up after the meeting and he will hand them out.

Membership: Sarah Perina. Sarah distributed a sheet showing membership percentages for each fall team. So far, Boys' Soccer is the clear winner with 59.5% of team members contributing. Good job Kathy Donahue! \$3210 is the total revenue so far!

Scholarship: Sue Huth. Sue says that this year's essays can be electronically submitted. She is also encouraging coaches to fill out their portion electronically. Sue is still looking for volunteer essay readers - 9th or 10th grade parents are ideal, as are people outside of York Suburban. Please give her a call (840-0042). October 30th is the deadline for fall teams.

School Directory: Greta Kottmyer. Not present. Tom spoke with her and she is getting lots of data.

Spirit Functions:

1. Spirit wear: Bob Perina. New spirit wear is rather behind this year. Was not happy with original designs so we are hoping to have some new merchandise by the next home game.
2. Posters: Rhonda Wissler. Not Present.
3. Meet the Teams: Bob Perina. Lots of feedback; will talk about it at the next meeting.

Team Allocation Scheduler: Kim George. No Report. We are in need of Booster Club members to sell at the outdoor concession stand on Friday, September 25th starting around 6:00 PM.

#### New Business:

1. Boys' Tennis team rep - Sharon Andrews' son might not be playing tennis this year so she is not interested in being the team rep.
2. Outdoor Concession Stand - The District is telling us we need a license to sell food. In addition, the District wants us to switch to precooked hamburgers. Tom checked out prices and it would be cost prohibitive - \$61.00 vs. \$17.00/cs.
3. Suburban 3 on 3 - October 10th - Celeste Hinnenkamp says the number of sponsors is down this year (we have 7 vs. 15 from last year). She wants donations of food for the concession stand. Anyone interested in donating can drop off food in lobby the night before or drop off at Celeste's front porch anytime. Celeste requests an honorarium for Jan Coyle for designing this year's Suburban Slam t-shirt design.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Bob Perina; a second was made by Brian Martin. The meeting was adjourned at 8:25 PM.

The next general meeting is scheduled for Monday, October 5 at 7:00 PM in room 121 at the high school.
